#### Introduction

The Pittsburgh Schizophrenia Conference is an annual meeting at which the advances in schizophrenia research are reviewed by leading experts in the field. This year's meeting will cover a range of topics, including wellness and the role of antioxidants and Omega-3 Fatty Acids in the biology and treatment of schizophrenia. Presentations by the faculty awarded the 2012 Pittsburgh Schizophrenia Conference Awards and the Gerard Hogarty Research Excellence Prize will also take place during the meeting. There will also be a panel addressing issues related to physical wellness and quality of life in persons with serious mental illnesses.

#### Who Should Attend

The conference is designed to disseminate the latest research findings to a wide audience: psychiatrists and other mental health clinicians, including nurses, social workers, psychologists, service coordinators, researchers, patients and their relatives, mental health policy administrators and others who intend to keep current regarding etiologic and treatment research in schizophrenia.

- Identify when it may be beneficial to employ both pharmacologic and behavioral treatments to improve cognition in persons living with a diagnosis of schizophrenia or related disorders.
